

Aughagower Old, Mayo

Sacred to the memory of/ Joseph Gale/ who lived to the advanced age of 137/ years without his ear being heavy or his/ eye dim. He died about the year 1770 (The Annual Register records his death in February 1769 and gives his age as 129)

Barna Roman Catholic, Galway

Pray for the soul of/ the Revd John Dooley/ Adm. Of Ragoon/ An Honest Man/ He died on the 19th of May 1871/ aged 83 years

Burrishoole Abbey, Mayo

This cross has been erected by/ the parishioners of Burrishoole/ to the memory of/ Fr. Manus Sweeney/ a holy and patriotic priest/ who was hanged in Newport/ June 8th 1799/ because he bowed with/ his countrymen/ in the rebellion of 1798 (Erected in 1912, the adjacent contemporary memorial to his parents simply adds 'F. Manus Sweeney their son who died/ June 8th 1799 aged 36 years')

Castlebar Church of Ireland, Mayo

In memory of/ Lieut Colonel Brown/of Breaffy in this county/ 4th Kings Own Regiment/ then of the 92nd Highlanders and 98th Foot/ He served King and Country/ in the expedition to Sweden/the retreat of Corumna, the lines of Torres Vedras/ Redhina, Fuentes D'Onor/ Ciudad-Rodrigo and the siege of Badajos/ where he was severely wounded/ the battles of/ Quatrebras and Waterloo/ there received three wounds from which he lay/ 48 hours for dead on the field of victory/ He died at Breaffy/ 20th Novr. 1849

Castlebar Church of Ireland, Mayo

Sacred/ to the memory of/ Edward John Thomas White/ Paymaster and Purser/ in the Royal Navy/ He died of fever/ caught in the discharge of special duties/ distributing seed for the Government/ to the distressed peasants of Mayo/ on the 25th July/ in the year of the Famine 1847/ aged 42 years

Castlebar Church of Ireland, Mayo

To the memory of Ann relict of/ (Rust?) Brooks formerly of Ipswich/ in the county of Suffolk England/and late Mess woman of the 89th Regiment/who died May (3?) 18(43?) aged 88 years

Castlebar Mall Memorial, Mayo

Pray for the soul of John Moore of Ashbrook Hall, Co. Mayo, Ireland's First President and descendant of St. Thomas More who gave his life for his country in the Rising of 1798 born Alicante Spain 1763 died a prisoner awaiting transportation in the city of Waterford 6-12-1799. By the will of the people he was exhumed and re-interred here with all Honours of Church and State 13-8-1961.

Dugort Church of Ireland Old, Achill Island, Mayo

Erected/ to the memory/ of Susan Harding/who depd this life/ Febry 28th 1844/ aged 7 months/ Sleep on sweet baby/ and wait the Almighty/ will then rise again/ and be an angel still

Glenhest, Mayo

Own and Mary &/ James Gill/ died in/ the seventh and/ eighth & ninth of/ their ages 1817 (Carving of Galway Hooker)

Kildavnet, Mayo

Have mercy O Lord/ on the soul of/ Joseph Gallagher/ who died March 15th 1891/ aged about 80 years/ also his wife Sally Gallagher/ who died (blank) aged (blank) years/ Only members of the family who die singly and/ without issue can be buried here

Kilgeever Old, Mayo

Pray for the soul/of/ Walter Heneghan/ Louisburgh/ who erected the Oratory/ on Croagh Patrick/ died May 20th 1913/ aged 65 years

Kilgeever Roman Catholic, Mayo

The Rev. Wm. Joyce P.P. Loiusburgh/ having paid out of his own private funds/ a debt of £200 incurred in the erection of the Presbytery/ which he now leaves free forever to his successors/ but on condition that 6 Masses will be said annually for ever for his intentions/ We approve of the above/ John Archbishop of Tuam 16th June 1888

Killanin Old, Galway

Sacred to the memory of Major/ Thomas William Poppleton of the/ 53rd Reg an officer immensely/ distinguished and brave accomplished/ and Christian soldier. He served in/ India, in Egypt, on the Peninsula/ and was honoured by the esteem of Napoleon who was under his personal charge for two years/ in St. Helena/ obiit October the 9th 1827/ aged 52 years

Lankhill, Co. Mayo

A famine burial ground with no memorials. There is one stone with the following inscription: 1839/ A record/ of the/ (m?)unificent/ of the Revd John Hensman/ and the congregation of/ Trinity Church/ (Cl?)ifton/ (En?)gland/ To (t?)he suffering/ pea(...) his Parish”.

Moycullen Old, Galway

S. K./ 1758 (carvings of hammer, anvil, L-shaped ruler and some unidentified shapes, perhaps pieces of molten metal?) There are also two other early 19th century memorials with carvings of a plough

Newport Church of Ireland, Mayo

In memory of Mathais de Bille/ Captain in the Royal Danish Navy/ born in Denmark February 14 1736/ died at Newport Ireland March 17 1782/ Captain Mathias de Bille/ in command of H. D. Mys Frigate Bornholm left Copenhagen for the Danish West India Islands Dec 14 1781/ The frigate took the route north of Scotland and encountered/ tempestuous weather in the Atlantic. Lost in a hurricane bowsprit/ and foremast and suffered other damage. The frigate driven by/ the storm towards the Northwest coast of Ireland narrowly/ escaped being wrecked on that shore succeeded however Jan 17 1782/ in reaching Newport where she remained to repair damages/ till ordered back to Copenhagen in August that year. A malignant fever had during the voyage broken out amongst the/ crew. A large building then standing on Mellows Point was/ converted into a Hospital for the crew of the frigate. Many/ of the sailors who died from the fever lie buried by the waterside in a field adjoining the Hospital/ Captain de Bille caught the fever and died in the town of Newport/ He was buried March 19th 1782 with all Military Honours in the/ old Parish Church-Yard of Newport/ A Corps of Volunteers under the command of their Colonel Sir Neale O'Donnell Bart furnished the Guard of Honour at the funeral/ This tablet has been erected/ A.D. 1876 to the memory of his grandfather/by Torbes de Bille/ who in the years 1860-5 filled the post /of His Danish Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary/ and Minister Plenipotentiary/ at the Court of St. James

Raheen House Private, Mayo

Cenotaph with three plaques: (The only trilingual memorial and the earliest Gaelic inscription)

- 1) Amarit/ et l'amour/par son cher epoux/ Dodwell 1809
- 2) Sírdhu do ciumna cuem cefa/ on! Ho mhufnin dicir d'inghid coidhce/ do laithif go bfat iafad nuriu!/ This cenotaph was built in memory of Maria/ Browne O'Donel 2d daughter of Sir Neal O'Donel
- 3) To gaiety and innocence

Roundstone Church of Ireland, Galway

To the memory of Mr./ William McCallay N.B.S./ of Roundstone Author/ of *Algae Hibernicus* and/ other/ works of merit. He/ gained considerable/ notoriety by his botanic/al discoveries in this local/ li... He died of/ Cholera on/ the 23rd of May 1849/ regretted by his parents/ and acquaintances

Spiddal, Galway

Sacred/ to the memory of George/ O'Malley RN who was sev/erely wounded in 1807 at/ the capture of/ Curacao/ in the West Indies He was/ wrecked near this place/ on his return to his native/ home/ This mark of respect/ to his memory was erected/ by his brother Edmd O'Malley RN late Pur/ser of HMS *Blannia*/ 120 guns
